REPRESENTATION IN THE ASSEMBLY.

Mr. WIDDIFIELD moved the second reading of the Bill to amend cap. 2, 38 Vic., respecting the readjustment of the representation of the Legislative Assembly. Carried.

MASTER AND SERVANTS' ACT.

Mr. O'DONOGHUE moved the second reading of the Bill to amend the Act respecting master and servant.

Mr. MOWAT said there was a question of jurisdiction involved in the Bill which was still doubtful. He hoped it would be withdrawn for the present.

Mr. CAMERON was of opinion that the Bill should not pass, as it was of the class legislation kind.

After some discussion the Bill was withdrawn.

MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

Mr. PAXTON moved the second reading of the Bill respecting Municipal Institutions. Carried.

Mr. MOWAT moved the adjournment of the House.

The House adjourned at 11:30.
