Mr. O'SULLIVAN repelled the aspersion that had been cast upon him, that his action in regard to the Central Prison had been influenced by religious motives. He moved to reduce the salary of the Warden to \$1,600.

Mr. McMAHON moved in amendment to the amendment a resolution affirming that, while concurring in the said resolution, the House recognises the great advantage to the people of this Province of having the Central Prison, where criminals might be confined and employed in some industrial occupation instead of remaining in idleness in the county gaols; and while admitting the difficulties of properly employing the prisoners at such work as will not come into competition with free labour, expressed the hope that the Government would not relax its efforts to employ the said prisoners in such a manner as would secure advantages to the Province and the reformation of the criminals, while, as heretofore, guarding as much as possible against competition with the ordinary free labour of the country.

Mr. FERRIS moved in amendment to the amendment that all the words after the word "that" be struck out of the amendment and the following substituted therefor:—"That the House, while concurring in the resolution, desires to express its opinion that it is to the interest of the Province to employ in the Agricultural College competent professors and assistants, and that unwisely reducing the salaries of officials in such College would result in impairing its efficiency."

Upon the item Immigration, \$27,000.

Mr. BELL moved a reduction of \$12,000. He claimed that the Government were wrong in bringing immigrants to this country when employment could not be found for the people who were already here.

Mr. O'DONOGHUE supported the amendment, saying that it would be well to wipe out all expenditure upon this branch of public service until the labour market was in a more favourable condition.

Mr. MORRIS said it would be well to promote emigration from the towns and cities to the new districts, but the present policy of expending money to bring emigrants from Europe was in part unwise. Therefore he moved in amendment to the amendment, "That in view of the present state of the labour market the Province does not desire any greater expenditure upon immigration, the expenditure by the Dominion Government being sufficient, and that the item be reduced by \$12,000."

Mr. HAY thought that owing to the present depression in Europe this was a most favourable time to promote immigration, and therefore any reduction would be most unwise.

Mr. McLAWS claimed that there was a great scarcity of farm labourers in Ontario, and that the people were satisfied with the immigration policy of the Government.

Mr. GRAHAM also upheld this view.

Mr. MEREDITH claimed that these figures were not correct, as the accounts of 1876 and 1877 included large amounts for arrears which were not found in 1878.
