

NOTICES OF MOTION.

Mr. Cascaden—On Friday next—Order of the House for a return showing: 1. All Provincial railways (Ontario) which were by the legislation of Parliament of Canada, of 1883, declared to be Dominion railways. 2. The mileage of each of the said railways. 3. The amounts paid to each by the Provincial Government and by the municipalities respectively.

Mr. Carnegie—Return showing the value on the 1st January, 1884, of the then outstanding scrip issued in aid of railways, calculating the payments to be made as capitalized at five per cent.

Mr. Merrick—Enquiry of the Ministry—Whether the Government has undertaken or agreed to undertake the defence of the suit of Walton v. Apjohn, or has employed or authorized the employment of a solicitor or counsel for the defendant in that suit. Whether the Attorney-General's attention has been called to the fact that his partner in business acting as counsel for the defendant in the said suit has raised as a defence to the suit the contention that Rat Portage is not within the limits of Ontario. Whether such contention was raised with the knowledge or approval of the Attorney-General.
