for the action of Police Megistrate Denison of Toronto, who had refused to endorse the warrant issued in Quebec for the arrest of Mr. E.

E. Sheppard, of Toronto.

The ATTORNEY-GENERAL said he did not consider that he was in any way responsible for the action of the Police Magistrate. The latter considered that in this matter of the warrant he was allowed by law to exercise his discretion as to whether or not he signed this warrant and he had exercised such discretion and had not signed it. The Attorney-General added that he had not looked up the law to see if the Police Magistrate were correct id this construction of the law. The House then, at 11.40 p.m., adjourned.
