Scott Act Fines:—A return brought dow by Mr. Hardy shows that last year \$93,21 was received for Scott Act fines in counties and \$31,466 in cities and towns. Middlese received the largest amount of any singl county—\$10,094; Northumberland and Dur ham received \$7,001; Port Hope \$2,92 and Cobourg \$1,500. The sum of \$10,150 was collected in the Town of Peterboro' The amount collected in Halton was only \$1,302.
