

PAYMENT OF JURORS.

Mr. Meredith's bill to amend the Jurors Act, by increasing the rate of payment from \$1 50 to \$2 per day, was read a second time. On behalf of the Government, however, Hon. Mr. Fraser said it was thought better to leave the question of increase to be determined by the different localities. Otherwise there was no objection to the bill, which then was sent to a special Committee.

TUBERCULOSIS.

Mr. Graham moved the second reading of the bill to prevent the sale of meat or milk from animals affected with tuberculosis. He made a neat little speech in support of the bill, showing how meat is at present sold for food when infected with poisonous diseases, and quoting an article from The London Free Press to prove his point. The bill was read a second time and referred to a special Committee composed of Messrs. Drury, Balfour, Sprague, French, Wylie, Willoughby, Gilmour, Lees, Dryden, Awrey and the mover.
