enable the churchwardens to borrow money for the erection of a rectory and other buildings. The House adjourned at 3.25 p.m. Public Works Department.

The report of H n. C. F. Fraser, Commissioner of Public Works, has been distributed.

Respecting the new Parliament buildings, the report shows that the masonry and brick work of the western wing are nearly completed and ready for the roof, work on the central portion and eastern wing is also in a forward state, and the whole building will be roofed in before the close of the building season of 1891. The expenditures last year on the new building aggregated about \$142,000, and the total expenditure to the end of the year was \$572,650. The work in connection with the cottages at Mimico was continued during the year, and the grounds round the four northern cottages graded and levelled. Five of the cottages are now occupied by about 300 patients. The sixth cottage will be occupied on the 3rd of February. and the seventh about the end of that month. The remaining eighth cottage will be completed before the 1st of May next, at which time the whole institution will be in good working order. These buildings will afford

accommodation for 500 patients. At the other public institutions necessary re-

pairs have been kept up and improvements made. The total expenditure of the depart-

ment for the year was \$626.029.
