To Protect Ginseng.

Dr. Caldwell's bill to provide fer the prevention of the extermination of the plant known as ginseng is an interesting one. Ginseng is a plant that grows somewhat extensively in Eastern Ontario, and whose root is used for med:cinal purposes, being shipped to New York, from which place it is sent to China. Last year between \$20,-000 and \$30,000 worth was sent from the country north of Kingston. It is worth from 50c to \$1 a pound as it is pulled, and from \$4 to \$6 a pound dry. It is the root that is valuable, and if the plant is pulled before the seeds on it ripen and fall to the ground, the plant is to that extent exterminated. Under the present reckless methods of the growers there is danger of the extermination of the plant, which may be effected in a few years unless something is done to stop it. Dr. Caldwell's bill is to prevent the pulling of the plant until after September 1 each year; the seeds will at that date have fallen to the ground.
