SPEECH FROM THE THRONE.

A Quiet Ceremony Closes the Last Session.

A List of One Hundred and Six Bills Assented to-The Seventh Legislature of Ontario Brought to an End.

Legislative Chamber, May 5. "It is his Honor's will and pleasure that this Legislative Assembly be prorogued, and this Legislative Assembly is accordingly prorogued." To Provincial Secretary Gibson belongs the distinction of having uttered these words, which closed the legislative career of the members of the seventh Legislature of Ontario. The scene was not a very impressive one. The lateness of the session had left but a slim attendance of members even for the closing days, and most of those who had remained till Friday evening had taken the early trains to their homes. The members of the Opposition particularly were conspicuous by their absence, Mr. Hammell acting as leader, constituting his own rank and file during the brief formal session that preceded prorogation, though one or two others came in afterwards. The Government was liberally represented, the Attorney-General being present, the star of St. Michael and St. George upon his breast. also Hon. A. S. Hardy, Hon. G. W. Ross, Hon, J. M. Gibson and Hon, John Dryden. There was also a sprinkling of Liberal members.

Of course there was no business done during the sitting that opened at 2.30, and not two minutes elapsed before the sitting was adjourned. Then there was a wait until 3 o'clock, when his Honor the Lieutenant-Governor entered, clad in official uniform, and supported by Commander Law, A.D.C., and Capt. Arthur Kirkpatrick, son of the Lieuterant-Governor.
