the council is a graceful recognition i of their high social and professional standing, and is what one would naturally expect from a Minister of Education who has ser ed so many years in the profession. The Opposition with this bill before them will not complain that the Government is grasping more power or that the Education Department is endeavoring to secure more political control in the administration of its affairs.
