over the Province. In the City of Toronto there was a decrease of 281 as compared with last year. The number of males committed during the year was 8,196, an increase of 133, while there was a decrease of 203 in the number of females committed. The committals during the year of boys and girls under sixteen years of age show an increase of six for boys and a decrease of seven for girls as compared with last year. There were 37 fewer commitments for drunkenness. Crimes against the person and against public morals and decency and offences against decreased, have public order against property crimes while convictions The have increased. were 60.01 per cent. of the committals. Some improvement in the matter of confining old people in jails as vagrants is noted. Full particulars of the committals and the working of the jails are given in the tables appended.

The archaeological report, which is issued as an appendix to the report of the Minister of Education, is a most interesting and valuable pamphlet, in which Mr. David Boyle has placed on record a great amount of information respecting the antiquities of the Province. The feature of the report is the colored reproduction of the remarkable rock paintings at Lake Massanog, together with Mr. Boyle's account of a visit there, which through the courtesy of Mrs. McLaren, wife of Hon. Peter McLaren of Perth, he was enabled to make. A series of valuable notes upon Ontario earthworks and primitive industries and working methods, illustrated by numerous cuts, are given, and the report states that the Provincial Museum in the Canadian Institute building has been enriched since last report by fully 3,500 specimens.

## THE PROVINCE'S ASSETS.

The statement of the Provincial assets which was laid before the House yesterday shows the total assets of the Province to be \$5,108,482 83. These are made up, first of all. by direct investments, aggregating \$470,883 89, composed of drainage 5 per cent, debentures invested Dec. 81, 1895, \$197,500 49; tile 5 per cent. debentures, \$134,165 15; drainage works, municipal amounts, \$136,218 25, and other debentures, etc., \$3,000. Next, capital held and debts due by the Dominion to Ontario, bearing interest, total \$4,200,018 05, made up of the U. C. Grammar School fund, \$312,-769 04; U. C. building fund, \$1,472,391 41; land improvement fund, \$124,685 18; the capital under the act of 1884, \$2,848,-289 52, less the estimated balance due the Dominion of \$2,000,000, leaving a balance of \$848,289 52; the Common School fund, of which Ontario's share is \$1,441,882 90. Finally, there are the bank balances, composed of \$350,000 special accounts and \$87,580 89 current accounts.

The liabilities amount to \$29,502 07, of which \$22,182 56 is due Quebec for collections on account of Common School lands in the last half-dozen years; \$6,-028 21 is due to municipalities from the land improvement fund, and \$1,291 80 due municipalities re surplus distribution. Thus the surplus of assets is \$5,-078,980 76.
