Much work and little, talking resulted in putting through the committee stage two important Government measures promoted by the Commissioner of Crown Lands-the bill to regulate the immigration into Ontario of certain classes of children, and the bill respecting loan companies. These bills were carefully considered, improved wherever possible, and reported. In addition to this satisfactory progress was made with the agr cultural estimates. This is the bill introduced by Currie last session.
