J. Davis, Provincial Secretary, in reference to the selection of a site for the new county poorhouse which it is proposed to erect at Beeton. In order to get the Government grant of \$4,000 towards the cost of the new building the site and plans have to be approved of by the Government inspector, and the deputation requested that no time should be lost in making the inspection. The Provincial Secretary promised that the inspector would give prompt atten-

tion to the matter.

Another deputation which was introduced to the Cabinet was composed of Capt. Armstrong, Stephen Armitage, Deputy Reeve of King; Messrs. Attridge, Michael Doyle, Dennis and W. Davis. They asked that the Government grant the usual subsidy towards the construction of a railway from some point on the Northern between Aurora and Newmarket to Schomberg, in King Township, a distance of fifteen miles. The Attorney-General informed the deputation that since 1881 the Legislature had unanimously decided not to make any more grants towards railways in the older settled portions of the Province.

Principals Loudon and Sheraton and Father Teefy had an interview with the Cabinet in respect to the bill promoted by Victoria University, respecting representation on the Senate of Toronto University. The two first named gentlemen are not altogether in favor

of the bill.
