Before a very slim House yesterday Dr. McKay moved the second reading of his bill involving such important consequences as have been explained to the medical faculty of Toronto University. The bill was opposed by the Minister of Education, who gave a number of strong reasons against any such serious changes as were contemplated in the absence of any general demand.
