Upper Canada College to Become Independent.

BOARD OF GOVERNORS.

Hon. Mr. Harcourt's Bill—Concessions From Subsidized Railways in Future—Toronto Railway Bill.

Two Government measures of importance were introduced in the Legislature yesterday by Premier Ross and Hon. Mr. Harcourt respectively. The Premier's bill provides for important concessions from railways which will in future receive subsidies from the Province. The bill introduced by the Minister of Education provides for the separation of Upper Canada College from the State and the appointment of a Board of Governors to manage the Institution. Considerable time was occupied in committee in discussing Hon. Mr. Latchford's fishery bill, several changes being made. The latter part of the evening was spent in Committee of Supply.

Toronto v. the Gas Company.

The Attorney-General will introduce a bill respecting the enforcement of certain contracts entered into with municipal corporations. The object of the measure is to enable a municipal corporation to take proceedings to enforce obligations either in favor of the corporation or of the inhabitants of a city, and to obtain the same relief to the same extent as if the Attorney-General were a party plaintiff. This legislation was promised by the Attorney-General before the session began, when an application was made for a fiat against the Consumers' Gas Company. Both the interested parties then appeared before him, and the matter was discussed. Some of the judgments rendered by the Privy Council go to show that in such a case the Attorney-General is not a necessary
