OBJECT TO THE LAND GRANT.

Opposition Denounce Algoma
Central Bill.

MR. WHITNEY'S OUTBURST

**A Vigorous Defence by Government
Members—Legislature Will Con-
clude To-day and Prorogue on
Monday.**

A sharp debate on the Algoma Central Railway land grant sprang up in the Legislature yesterday, and owing to its duration the House will not conclude until some time this afternoon. The arrangements are now that the prorogation ceremonies shall take place on Monday at 3 o'clock. On the motion for the third reading of the railway bill, Mr. Whitney, in his customary vigorous style, denounced the grant as a phenomenal steal, and as a crime on the part of the Government. He was followed by Mr. Conmee, Mr. German, Mr. Pattullo and other Government members, who pointed out the absolute necessity of the railway in order to the opening up of the country, and the stringent provisions of the agreement. Mr. Carscallen, Mr. Eilber, Mr. Hoyle and others spoke for the Opposition.
