## NO ELECTION THIS YEAR.

Premier Ross' Intimation to the Legislature.

## NORMAL SCHOOL PUPILS.

An Emphatic Denial That Politics
Plays Any Part in the Consideration of Applications-Legislature
Notes.

Premier Ross, replying to the leader of the Opposition at yesterday's session of the Legislature, intimated that the present intention of the Government was that the House should hold another session before an election was held. The result of this answer will in all probability be a shortening of the present session, and a rearrangement of the fighting tactics which the Opposition had planned in view of the persistent rumors to the effect that an election would be held during the coming summer. The Minister of Education, replying to Mr. Barr (Dufferin), emphatically denied that political influence played any part in the treatment of applications for seats in the normal schools, or in any branch of the department's work.

Mr. Whitney asked:—Is it the intention of the Government to make provision during the present session, by permanent annual grant or otherwise, for the need of the University of Toronto, or the University of Queen's College, Kingston, or either of them?

Hon. Mr. Harcourt replied:—The m'tter to which the question of my nonorable friend refers is being carefully considered.
