Address of the Imperial
Authorities.

THE COMPANIES ACT.

Proposed Changes Discussed in the
Legislature—Col. Leys Denies Re-
ported Threat to Resign.

At yesterday's session of the Legislature the debate on the memorial to the Imperial authorities regarding a remount station in Ontario was resumed and concluded, the address being adopted unanimously. Hon. Mr. Stratton's bill to amend the Ontario companies act was discussed at some length, and some clauses were finally left over for further consideration. Before adjournment the Premier stated that the beet-root sugar, the volunteers bill and other Government measures will be taken up to-day.

Bills Introduced.

Col. Matheson (South Lanark) introduced an amendment to the general road companies act to enable municipalities to appropriate taxes received from road companies to form a fund for the purchase of stock in the road companies, and that if they acquire the whole stock the road is to be toll free; and enabling municipalities lying within three miles of the road to contribute likewise.

Mr. Holmes (Haldimand) introduced a bill to amend the liquor license act by providing that tavern licenses may be paid half-yearly in all other municipalities as well as cities.

Committee on Fender Penalty.

Mr. Marter (North Toronto) moved that the following members comprise the special committee to consider his bill for violations by street railway companies of the law requiring fenders and guard wires: Messrs. Dryden, Pardee, Charlton, Davis, Foy, Dickenson and Marter.
