

Hon. Mr. Gibson agreed with this view. It would not do to let promoters and those interested in bills get the idea that they could get a bill referred back by the House, after passing through committee, in the hope of getting a committee more favorable to their views. If business was conducted in that way the session would never be finished.

Mr. Hill declined to withdraw the motion, and it was declared lost on division.

Location of Sanitaria.

Mr. Hill (West York) moved the second reading of his bill to amend the

public health act by providing that hospitals or sanitarium for the care of consumptives shall not be established within municipalities without the consent of the local Boards of Health.

Hon. Mr. Stratton said that this question, which had received consideration in previous sessions, was at a stage where a definite conclusion could be reached. The bill should go to the committee.

Mr. Whitney thought the measure a good one.

The bill was given its second reading. The House adjourned at 3.50.
