failed entirely to prove, and it was no wonder therefore that they had been

a little disappointed.

Mr. J. S. Duff (West Simcoe) and Mr. Milton Carr (Parry Sound) made short speeches, and the motion to receive the report was declared carried on division.

The House then proceeded with its routine business, and the balance of the third readings were rapidly put

through.

The House went into committee on a number of Government bills before putting them through third readings. Col. Gibson made a few amendments to the bill to amend the judicature act. One amendment provided for calling the new fourth division of the High Court the "Exchequer Division."

Mr. Latchford withdrew his bill to create a Provincial board of conciliation and arbitration, as there was much difference of opinion upon the subject, and it could not be given the full consideration that it merited during the

present session.

Col. Gibson withdrew his bill to improve and make certain tax titles for a similar reason.

## Adjourned Till This Morning.

Mr. Ross then moved that the House adjourn until 11 o'clock this morning, and sit until 1 o'clock. They would be able to conclude the work during that time. They would go into supply, and his Honor the Lieutenant-Governor would attend to assent to the remainder of the bills.

Mr. Whitney said that he did not know whether there was anything else

to be put on the order paper.

Mr. Ross replied that if any members desired to ask questions or move for returns, etc., they would not be stopped, and the House would take the matters up next week.

The House adjourned at 12.05 a.m.
