deposited \$900 in the forenoon of September 11th. There were two sides to the report, said Dr. Nesbitt: a campaign side and a side calculated for

use in the House.

What inference was to be drawn from the letter by Mr. Gamey, saying that there was no consideration offered for his support? They had a right to be suspicious when such a statement was made, that there had been some consideration, and they had a right to be suspicious in view of the actions of the Ministers on many other occasions of late years.

At 10 o'clock Dr. Nesbitt moved the adjournment, and he will resume his speech when the House opens this

morning at II o'clock.

At the conclusion of the afternoon session Mr. Whitney asked when the printed copies of the evidence would be ready. The Premier replied probably on Saturday morning. One copy, he hoped, would be ready this morning.

Inquiries of Ministers.

Mr. Macdiarmid-Will Mr. A. E. Ames, as Chairman of the Temiskaming & Northern Railway Commission, have control of the disposition or sale of the bonds authorized under bill 187? Has Mr. A. E. Ames tendered his resignation as Chairman of the said commission? If not, is it the intention of the Government to ask him to do so?

Mr. Ross informed Mr. Foy that the evidence would probably be printed and distributed by Saturday morning, and that perhaps one copy would be ready

to-day.
