The Premier—No, only one. It was done from the King's Printer's Department, and the price is a considerable reduction. The motion was carried on division.

The Premier also moved for ratification of an agreement for the printing of the House with Warwick Bros. & Rutter, to end on July 1, 1904, as approved by order in Council. New tenders would be called for for five years after that date. The extension was for the purpose of completing the year. The rates of the union had gone up during the last year, and it was thought wise to extend the agreement under the old rate rather than call for new tenders for the short period. The motion was carried.

Correspondence Returned.

Hon. Mr. Stratton presented a return of the correspondence connected with the payment of wages at the "Soo," as requested by Mr. Whitney.

After recess the House went into committee and passed the estimates for the following departments:—Crown Lands, \$73,375; Public Works, \$45,250; Provincial Secretary, \$22,925; inspection of public institutions, \$19,150; license and audit of justice accounts, \$10,450; Registrar-General, \$15,100; Board of Health, \$9,000; Agriculture, \$30,150; insurance, \$9,050; neglected children, \$6,800; miscellaneous, \$16,000.

The House adjourned at 10.20 o'clock.
