Ross, in conclusion, "we thank him. So far as he has departed we will oppose him. Let us have progressive legislation, every inch of it we can; let us not recede a single inch. I think this country can go much farther than the hon. gentleman has done."

Mr. Gamey occupied the attention of the House long enough to express the opinion that the resolution passed by the Liberal convention and referred to previously was valueless, because nearly all the licenses then issued in new Ontario or applied for were for organized municipalities or judicial districts.
