Monck, was supplied with details regarding the new Government House. The Government had paid \$127,946 for the site, and clearing and laying out were expected to cost \$69,000, of which \$52,557 had been spent. The estimated cost of the new building was \$100,000.

The House was again in committee, putting the barristers act and the solicitors act through that stage. Both are statute revisions contain-

ing only unimportant changes.

## No Telephone Commissioner.

In response to questions put on the order paper by Mr. N. W. Rowell, K. C., Sir James stated that Hon. I. B. Lucas had not been appointed a Commissioner to investigate the question of Government ownership of telephones. He remarked that Mr. Lucas had considered various matters in connection with telephone systems with a view to seeing whether legislation was necessary.

Hon. Dr. Pyne introduced a bill to provide for the appointment of a Board of Governors for the Provincial Museum, which will henceforth be known as the Royal Ontario

Museum.

## Salary Increases.

In addition to the lump sums which have been noted, every department of the Government shows a number of salary increases, ranging from \$50 to \$200 per year. In the highways branch of the Public Works Department the engineer gets an increase of \$250. The Deputy Registrar-General and Secretary of the Provincial Board of Health, Dr. J. S. W. Mc-Cullough, will receive \$200 per anmore. The new Assistant Deputy Minister of Agriculture will receive \$1.167. For the tuberculosis and public health exhibits \$1,000 each is granted. Thunder Bay district will have a Police Magistrate in connection with C. N. R. construction, who will receive \$1.200. Other salary increases in nominal sums go to Deputy Ministers, clerks, stenographers, inspectors, etc.
