Not only in regard to territory, but also in the adjustment of the financial relations between the Dominion and the Province, has the Ontario Government been remiss, according to the contention of Opposition speakers in the Legislature yesterday on the continuation of the boundary debate arising out of Mr. N. W. Rowell's resolution. Mr. J. C. Elliott (West Middlesex) continued the discussion, moving a further amendment to that of Mr. Gamey that it was not too late for Ontario to press her claims at Ottawa; that the extension of the Provincial Railway to Nelson River virtually through Manitoba territory would cost the Province the legislative control of the railway; and in any event the \$10,000,000 which would be necessary to do this would only result in the colonization of Manitoba.
