Stock Off the Highways

Hon. F. C. Biggs, Minister of Highways, introduced a bill in the Legislature yesterday, amending the Provincial Highways Act. It prohibits the running at large of stock on the Provincial highways. An amendment to the Highways Improvement Act provides that, in counties issuing debentures for road improvements, the amount may be five instead of three per cent. of the assessed values. This amendment also changes the name of the Provincial county roads to roads termed Class A and Class B. Mr. Biggs said he was ready to accept any better name than the ones suggested in the bill. The amendment provides for the capitalization of the income from motor license fees for road purposes:
