then introduced an amendment to the amendment to the amendment to the Address in reply to the Speech from the Throne, and his amendment was declared out of order by the Speaker.

Highways Taxation.

E. P. Tellier (Lib., North Essex), in his first address in the Legislature, declared himself to be a straight follower of W. E. N. Sinclair, the Provincial Liberal Leader, and congratulated the Premier upon his choice of an official Opposition Leader.

Mr. Tellier criticized a system of highways taxation which compelled the farmer on the back concessions to pay heavily for good roads of no im- rediate, benefit to him, and opposed the system of collecting amusement taxation from every rural social affair and amateur athletic event.

The vote was then taken.
