London Deputation Uraes Greater Efficiency With Fewer Members

PREMIER IS SYMPATHETIC

Authority for reduction in membership of the London School Board from twelve to six members will, if granted by the Department of Education, be vested in the City of London Bill, which will be considered at an early date by the Private Bills Committee of the Legislature.

A deputation from the London Board waited on Premier Ferguson yesterday, to press the claim that reduction in the membership would mean more efficient administration. The Prime Minister expressed his sympathy for the principle of the thing, but declined to give a decision until he had consulted departmental officials on details of the venture contemplated.
