Hon. John S. Martin, Minister of ter of Agriculture, no one could go into a Toronto fruit store without seeing "bruised and broken" Ontario apples. Much of the responsibility for the situation, said he, lay with people who drove into the country with barrels, bought up "windfalls," and deceived buyers by covering the "poor stuff" with a few layers of good apples.

There was no legislation at the present time, he said, to control this creasing yearly, and reacting seriously on the shipping trade.
