# \$2,470,000 PROVIDED IN SUPPLEMENTARIES FOR HYDRO EXTENSION

**Total of \$7,546,000 in Monteith Budget — U. of T. Granted \$1,188,000, \$90,000 for Reforestation, \$75,000 for Building for Insane Prisoners at Guelph**

**\$2,500 FOR "NANCY"; \$75 FOR COW'S DEATH**

Supplementary estimates tabled in the Legislature yesterday with the introduction of Provincial Treasurer Monteith's second Budget total \$7,546,154.44.

By departments, the amounts to be voted are as follows: Prime Minister's, \$2,474,975; Legislation, \$4,400; Attorney-General's, \$19,015; Insurance, \$4,375; Education, \$2,068,151; Lands and Forests, \$120,000; Mines, \$6,483; Game and Fisheries, \$12,495; Public Works, \$1,892,089.34; Highways, \$4,275; Health, \$42,150; Labor, \$168,000; Provincial Treasurer's, \$19,550; Provincial Auditor's, \$19,600; Provincial Secretary's, \$502,326.10; Agriculture, \$120,325; and Miscellaneous, \$67,945.

**\$10,000 for Sault Area.**

The chief item in the Prime Minister's estimates is for Hydro. This estimate of \$2,470,000 includes \$400,000 for the Niagara system; \$1,600,000 for the St. Lawrence and Ottawa systems; and \$365,000 for the Central Ontario system. Seventy-five thousand dollars is to be voted for the Georgian Bay system, and \$20,000 for the Nipissing system. For rural extensions in the Sault Ste. Marie district \$10,000 will be provided.

Department of Education votes include salaries of \$4,800 and \$4,400 for the Director of English instruction and the Director of French instruction, respectively. These posts were created under the regulations which replaced Regulation 17 under the Government's policy regarding the bilingual schools.

**Special Grants.**

Special grants—University of Toronto, \$1,188,151; Queen's University, \$300,000; Western University, \$300,000, and Royal College of Dental Surgeons, \$17,137.50—are provided for in the "Education" estimates.

Ninety thousand dollars is provided for reforestation purposes under Lands and Forests Departmental estimates. Eighty-three dollars is to be voted, under the Department of Mines, to D. G. Sinclair for loss of personal effects in a hotel fire at Mine Centre, July 23, 1927. Two thousand three hundred and twenty dollars is asked by the Game and Fisheries Department for the purchase of the Indian reserve in connection with the Chapleau Crown Game Preserve from the Department of Indian Affairs at Ottawa. There is a vote of \$6,825 under Public Works for equipment and service re floodlighting and decorations at Queen's Park in connection with the Jubilee of Confederation celebrations.

Sixty thousand dollars is to be voted for the new amusement hall in connection with the Ontario Hospital at Hamilton; \$26,000 for the completion of the laundry building at the Ontario Hospital, Kingston; \$10,000 to provide the London Hospital with a cold storage plant; \$18,000 for the purchase and installation of a laundry plant for the same institution; \$30,500 for the completion of the laundry building at the Brockville Mental Hospital; \$18,000 to provide for payment to Etobicoke Township for sewer connections; \$40,000 for storehouse building at the Ontario Hospital, Whitby; \$100,000 for new building at Woodstock Hospital, accommodating 400 patients.

**\$75,000 for Reformatory.**

Seventy-five thousand dollars is to be voted for building for criminal insane prisoners at Ontario Reformatory, Guelph; \$75,000 for purchase of land, etc., for Boys' Training School, Bowmanville; \$205,000 for construction of Ontario Training College for technical teachers, Hamilton; \$50,000 for horticultural building, O.A.C., Guelph, and \$2,500 for raising and housing the hull of his Majesty's schooner Nancy.

Seventy-five dollars is voted under Public Highways estimates to recompense J. W. Chambers of Tillsonburg for the death of a cow killed by a highway traffic officer while in the execution of his duty.

Additional allowances in accordance with the Mothers' Allowances Act figures in these estimates to the tune of \$144,000.

Under agriculture \$10,000 is asked for services, expenses and equipment in carrying on social research work with the Empire Marketing Board. Miscellaneous votes are: Grant to Ontario Division of the Canadian Red Cross, \$23,495; grant to Ontario Safety League, \$15,000; grant to Last Post Fund, \$2,000, and \$25,000 for wolf bounties.
