Disagrees on Roads.

A. J. Kennedy, Conservative member for Timiskaming, disagreed with Mr. Legault on the matter of road outlets, stating that there wasn't a settler in his electoral district—even though the district was much younger than the Sturgeon Falls member's—that didn't have a road to get out on. Mr. Kennedy did admit, however, that there was room for improvement in the manner in which the settlers worked their property.

"The trouble in the North, and it's the same sometimes in the South, is that the settlers are too spoon-fed," he said. "I have known of settlers who took lands fifteen years ago, and haven't any more than three acres cleared at the present time. Why, a couple of beaver could have done more work in the same time."
