AT THE SPEAKER'S RECEPTION FOLLOWING OPENING OF 18th LEGISLATURE



The traditional booming of guns, the prancing steeds of the mounted escort for the Lieutenant-Governor, the twin khaki lines of the guard of honor—these were the outward signs of the opening yesterday of the Eighteenth Legislature of Ontario.
