MONDAY SET ASIDE TO DISCUSS HYDRO

Great Interest Evidenced in New Rural Power Bills

Premier Ferguson told the Legislature yesterday that, in view of the exceptional interest being manifested in the Government's legislation to provide cheaper power rates for rural Ontario, and to set up loans for those farmers who otherwise would be unable to meet the installation of equipment costs, next Monday would be set aside for further discussion of the Hydro question.

An opening for the discussion will be provided when Hon. J. R. Cooke, Hydro Commissioner, will move second reading of the Rural Power District Loans Act.

Yesterday was a quiet day in the House, with only seven or eight bills advanced another stage toward legislative enactment, to keep the House sitting.

An act to amend the Voters' List Act, which stood in the name of William Newman (Liberal, North Victoria) was withdrawn by its sponsor because it was out of order.
