Tory Farmer Is a Good Companion If You Haven't a Gun License

Charles A. Robertson, Liberal member for North Huron, told the Legislature yesterday a story with a moral. From the point of view of the Opposition groups it was a particularly good tale, too.

In attacking the Government's gun-license policy, Mr. Robertson related that one day this winter a Conservative farmer and a couple of friends and "some other fellows" went out for a little fun, toting firearms, but no licenses. Next day the game warden "had them" for breach of the game laws.

The next day after that the game warden said there had been a mistake, and the guns that had been confiscated were returned, and the informations that had been pending were withdrawn.

"If," said Mr. Robertson, "the hunters were in the wrong in the first place—as they undoubtedly were—they were in the wrong all through, and the game warden should have held firm."
