ONTARIO SUPPORT ASKED

Price to Move Approval of Bennett Plan

The B.N.A. Act and associated issues will be raised at Queen's Park by the Conservative Opposition. A resolution and a query—both bearing on the vexed issue of the rights of the Province and the Dominion—have been placed on the Order Paper.

The subject is touched on by Hon. W. H. Price in his notice of a motion which asks for a vote favoring Ottawa social reforms. The former Attorney-General couples a resolution approving the principle of Right Hon. R. B. Bennett's unemployment insurance and other social insurance with a rider.

"Be it resolved," it reads, "that this Legislature is prepared to supplement, complement, or augment such laws of the Parliament of Canada by Provincial legislation so that the Dominion-wide scope of unemployment insurance may be maintained without recourse to litigation over questions of jurisdiction."

Hon. George S. Henry, in a query, asks if the Government intends to cooperate with the Dominion or with a House of Commons Committee to bring in a report on B.N.A. amendments.
