this whole question is the tremendous difference in methods of assessment throughout the Province. That in itself presents an insuperable barrier to the immediate solution of the problem.

"I might also explain that before a Royal commission could be appointed to conduct the necessary inquiry, a reorganization of the Department of Education was absolutely necessary to provide the essential background for the proceedings before that commission. That reorganization has taken place and we are now ready to proceed with the selection of the commission and the planning of the procedure to be followed.

"In the meantime, we are taking very definite steps to improve the situation, both as to the cost of education and the status of the teachers.

"Three million, five hundred housand dollars will be contributed this year to the cost of education by the Ontario Government, in addition to anything which has been paid in the past. It will go directly to the cost of education. No similar increase has ever before been carried into effect in one year in this Province.

"This is, however, merely a temporary measure, adopted in the face of present difficulties, and not to be looked upon as an alternative to the undertaking we have given and which we are determined to carry out."
