Ontario Legislature had decided to usual in the afternoon, the House adjourn to 2 o'clock this afternoon to put through unfinished estimates. Twenty-eight bills received third Further adjournment will be made reading. to Wednesday, when prorogation is expected.

At 2 o'clock this morning the 21st, Starting two hours earlier than made good progress in the five-hour day session, and resumed at 8 p.m.

> Lieutenant-Governor Albert Matthews was on hand to prorogue the Legislature. This procedure is unusual, though not unprecedented. In most years the business of the House is finished at a night session and prorogation takes place the following day. An out-of-town engagement this afternoon, made some time ago by the Lieutenant-Governor, compelled a change in plan.

> There were 102 bills introduced in the session. Nine were withdrawn, five were defeated, and one was partly added to another bill. Eighty-seven bills passed through all stages, not a record, although the largest legislative program in some years.
