Service Vote Act Receives Assent

Royal assent was given by Lieutenant- Governor Albert Matthews in the Ontario Legislature yesterday to five Government bills, including the Active Service Voting Act which provides a direct ballot for Ontario voters in the armed services, and a proxy vote for Ontario prisoners-of-war.

Premier Drew told the Legislature the reason for having assent given at this time was to permit the Attorney-General's Department to proceed with negotations with the Federal Government regarding regulations of the Federal Active Service Voting Act.

In the course of the bill through the Legislature, Attorney-General Leslie Blackwell had agreed with Opposition members that Dominion regulations should be followed as closely as possible in the Provincial Act.
