The Adjutant General desires to call the particular attention of Commanding Officers of Militia, where the following General Orders are applicable on Militia Service, in order to avoid the unnecessary expense and trouble of corresponding on the subjects to which they refer.

MILITIA GENERAL ORDERS.

As often as Officers in Command of Regiments may find it necessary to recommend Officers for promotion, to His Honor the President, or Person Administering the Government of this Province, strict attention must be given, that such Officers are recommended according to their seniority in the Regiment.

Should there be any case wherein it might be proper to depart from the foregoing rule, it must be stated for His Honor's determination thereon.

In future when an Officer is desirous of Resigning, his application in writing must be transmitted to this Office through his Commanding Officer.
