THE SHIPS OF THE PATERSON FLEET

Last month we presented a very brief mention of this new book from T.M.H.S. members Gene Onchulenko and Skip Gillham. We thought we had more room available than proved to be the case, and unfortunately our review turned out to be far more brief than we had intended. Our apologies to the authors.

The individual Paterson ship histories provide a valuable record, but the book's greatest value, in our opinion, lies in the large number of well reproduced and, in some cases, very rare photos. The inside photos are in black-and-white, but the covers are in colour; PATERSON (II) is on the front cover, while the back features a stunning overhead view of the handsome ONTADOC (I).
