As a result of the generosity of our members, we have had numerous items, such as books, magazines, photos, etc., for sale at recent meetings, the proceeds donated to the Toronto Marine Historical Society. The funds derived from the sale of such donated materials helps to protect all of our members from increases in the Society's annual membership fees.

Recently, we have received donations of six very special items of marine memorabilia, which we believe should be offered to all of our members, and these will now be sold by silent auction. Each item is described in detail, and a reserve (minimum) bid is shown for each.

- 1. LIFEBOAT COMPASS No. 28432 B4, manufactured by Henry Browne & Son Limited, Station Works, Barking, Essex, England. Certified as tested 1961. Gimballed compass contained in wooden box approx. $7\frac{1}{2}$ " across, 5" high, $7\frac{1}{2}$ " deep. Box shows signs of weather but overall in very good condition. From a lake vessel. Reserve Bid \$75.00
- 2. AZIMUTH MIRROR manufactured by Kelvin & Hughes Ltd., London and Glasgow. Contained in wooden box 12" across, 4" high, 12" deep. Box also contains circular mirror $6\frac{1}{2}$ " diameter and a frosted glass disc $5\frac{1}{2}$ " diameter. Box slightly weathered but mirror in excellent condition. From a lake vessel. Reserve Bid \$75.00
- 3. MISENER HOUSEFLAG blue field with gold 'M' and three gold crowns. Approx. 8'3" long, 4'3" wide. Unused. Very choice item for anyone with a flagpole or a large wall space to fill. Reserve Bid \$35.00
- 4. STENCILLING PLATE manufactured by Toledo Stamp & Stencil Co., brass, approx. 6½" x 6", with cut-out lettering STR. JAMES DAVIDSON in block letters arranged in semi-circular format. Unused, but probably intended for labelling lifejackets. (JAMES DAVIDSON was built in 1920, scrapped 1974.) Reserve Bid \$25.00
- 5. ALGOMA CENTRAL MARINE HOUSEFLAG black, red and white burgee with traditional bear design. Approx. 7'5" long, 3'4" wide at hoist, tapering to 2' at tips of swallowtail. Unused. Very handsome item. Reserve Bid \$35.00
- 6. SHIP'S KEY 4½" long, with brass tag attached by short chain. Tag stamped in block letters PILOT HOUSE PORT on one side, J. W. GATES on the other. (JOHN W. GATES was built for A. B. Wolvin in 1900 and sailed for Pittsburgh Steamship Company from 1901. Scrapped 1961.) Reserve Bid \$15.00
