ADDITIONAL MARINE NEWS

Our lead Marine News item this issue concerns the G.L.A.-chartered self-un-loader JOSEPH H. FRANTZ. We can also report that the FRANTZ arrived at Goderich on August 22nd to load wheat, presumably for delivery to Buffalo. It is very, very rare for a Kinsman vessel to load grain at Goderich, although we believe that KINSMAN INDEPENDENT (iii) did it once and so did KINSMAN ENTER-PRISE (ii).

Our second Marine News item on Page 2 concerns the new L.L.T. vessel MICHI-PICOTEN (iii). For those who record such information, we should mention that unlike L.L.T.'s other Canadian-registered ships, namely CUYAHOGA, SAGINAW and MISSISSAGI, all of which are registered to Lower Lakes Towing Ltd., Port Dover, the registered owner of MICHIPICOTEN is Port Dover Steamship Company Inc., Port Dover.

An interesting sight on Lake Ontario this summer has been the McKeil tugs CARROL C. 1 and BONNIE B. III towing 1.5 km. sections of pipe from Belleville to Toronto for use in the Deep Water Cooling Project which will provide cold water for use in the air conditioning of downtown Toronto buildings. The pipe is being joined and installed by McNally Marine Inc.
