Help keep wildlife safe with
these tips for homeowners

Spring and summer are prime nesting seasons for a variety of wildlife that might be found on your property.

Here are a few ways to help keep them safe.

Check shrubs for tiny occupants before pruning.

Keep cats inside, dogs on leash and check your lawn before mowing to keep young animals safe.

Keep your yard clear of strings so animals won't become tangled.

Keep a swimming pool cover on when the pool is not in use.

Install a chimney screen to prevent nesting.

Store garbage in a container with a tight-fitting lid. Visit flap.org for tips on preventing birds from striking windows.

If you find a wildlife baby, it is probably not an orphan. The parent may be nearby but hiding from you. Some young animals may look like orphans but

are living independently. A wild animal needs help if it has obvious injuries, has a dead parent nearby, is covered in fleas or is shivering.

Call the Oakville Milton Humane Society at 905-845-1551 if you see an animal in distress. The OMHS Emergency Service is available

24 hours a day, seven days a week.

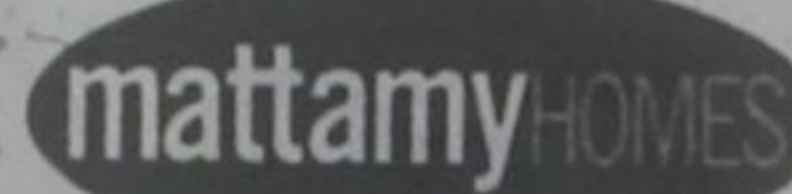
