

month-long gun amnesty program nets 60-plus More than 60 items were turned in during Halton Regional Police's month-long gun amnesty program in April. Between April 1 and 30 items handed into police included 19 shotguns, 21 rifles, seven handguns, nine air guns, two miscellaneous gun-related items including a silencer, and four prohibited weapons - including a baswitchblade nunchakus. Several thousand rounds of ammunition were also turned in to HRPS. The regional amnesty program, part of a provincewide initiative, provided the community with the option of handing over unwanted or illegal guns, ammunition or explosives, without

any criminal penalties. The goal is to get unwanted weapons into the hands of law enforcement, who can then oversee their lawful destruction, preventing them from falling into the hands of criminals.
