5 things to do in Halton this Victoria Day long weekend

There's plenty to see and do this Victoria Day long weekend in Halton. Here's a rundown of five things to do this long weekend across the region.

- 1 **The Milton Farmers' Market** has been bringing goods and hospitality to downtown Milton since 1972. During the May long weekend, the farmers market will be open on Main Street on May 19 from 7 a.m. to 12 p.m.
- 2 **Firework shows** will be put on every night during the Victoria Day long weekend in Milton. Starting on May 19 at 12 p.m. and ending on May 21 at 11 p.m., the Kaboom Fest at the Milton Fairgrounds will be a fun-filled weekend with fireworks, midway rides, food trucks, vendors and entertainment. Admission tickets and passes are available in advance at www.kaboomfest.ca.
- 3 **Spruce Lane Farmhouse** at Bronte Creek Provincial Park between Oakville and Burlington is hosting a historical spring celebration for Victoria Day. Spring Time on the Farm will have historical demonstrations, hands-on activities, Victorian games, and farm animals all on May 21 from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. There's no additional cost for entrance to Spring Time on the Farm other than regular park admission fees.
- 4 Enjoy a **Victorian Tea Party** at Bronte Creek Provincial Park between Oakville and Burlington from May 19 at 11 a.m. to May 21 at 3 p.m. Tea and cake will be served, as well as quilts, crafts and handcrafted woodworking will be available for purchase at the Tea Party. Craft values range from \$5 to \$60, cash or credit purchases only.
- 5 To start off the May long weekend for kids fun, **Fairytale Friday with Snow White** is on May 18 from 6 p.m.-7:30 p.m. in Milton at 189 Main St. E. Suited for children ages four through seven, Fairytale Friday will have a variety of dress up activities, nail polish, simple face paint, arts and crafts, dancing and themed Tea Parties with their favourite character.
