Thank you for this opportunity to address this topic affecting Miltonians today. When people's incomes are locked into making big mortgage payments or paying high rents, local communities, families and economies are vulnerable. It is unacceptable that more people are on a waiting list for social housing than the total number of homes available.

The housing crisis is a complex problem that re-

quires creative solutions. Those solutions need to start with what works for people, not speculators.

As Green MPP, I will strive to require new developments to provide a minimum of 20 per cent affordable homes. I support innovative solutions such as tiny homes, co-housing and secondary suites.

Greens will invest an additional \$200 million over projected increases in the 2018 budget in funding for shelters, co-op and supportive housing. These changes to development, zoning and planning rules will not cost citizens more tax dollars; we will increase the housing speculation tax to help the most vulnerable have a place to call home.

Young families can afford to buy a home, seniors can afford to stay in their homes, and no one should be forced to sleep on the street. Having a roof over your head makes life better for everyone.
