'We all got ripped off', says father of windstorm victim

Plater remembered for his intelligence, athleticism and big heart

As the giant 'Z' balloon ascends the night sky, Lex Plater can't help but smile.

It's an unexpected moment of solace in a weeken'd filled with anguish - for his family, and countless others.

"They'd gotten this giant Z balloon for Zach, but the Z was going up crooked. Knowing Zach, we all said he would have been beside himself (to see that)," recalled the still grieving father, of the memorial evening sciences program. friends and family put together at Brookville Public School to honour his beloved 18-year-old son, killed during the May 4 windstorm.

student on June 4.


"He gave it (martial arts) everything there was never any complaining. He was such a joy to be around. He was a special young man."

"Karate has taught me so many things that I use in my everyday life. The first thing is respect. It spect for others is essential, and everyone deserves it until proven otherwise."

As driven in the classroom as he was on the playing field - where he excelled in football and basketball as well as karate — Zach earned the Halton District School Board's Student of Excellence Award at Brook-

ville Public School, and had one of Ontario's top-50 scores in a university math test when he was only in Grade 8.
