Donations with an overall theme like arts and crafts, science, sports or writing and literature are encouraged.

Many of these items are

extremely difficult to get in secluded and impoverished communities in northern Ontario and other parts of Canada.

Those filling a shoebox are asked to include an open envelope with \$5 for distribution expenses. A happy note to the young recipient is also encouraged.

Do not wrap or decorate the box.







