The Halton Women's Place provides shelter and crisis services for physically, emotionally, financially and sexually abused women and their depen-

dent children.

Anyone wishing to donate to the gift card campaign, can drop the cards off at the Metroland Media Group West office at 901 Guelph Line in Burlington during regular business hours, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Donations will be accepted until after business hours on Friday, Dec. 14.
