

# BEIN THE KNOW FOR SNOW

Town operations crews are ready to face the challenge of the coming winter season and ask residents to work with us to weather the storms.

Roads are maintained in a priority sequence beginning with Regional Roads, arterial and collector roads. During a snowstorm, road crews will keep these roads as clear as possible to ensure the safety of drivers and allow for emergency vehicles to respond to calls quickly and safely.

### Priority roads - Regional/ arterial/collector:

Once 2 cm of snow has accumulated, roads are plowed in a priority sequence, starting with Regional roads, followed by arterial and then collector roads. These roads are cleared to bare pavement within 2 to 12 hours after the end of the storm, depending on how much snow has accumulated.

### Parking:

During a storm, please allow the plow by NOT parking your car on the street. Vehicles left on the street pose an obstacle to snow-clearing activities, making it unsafe for both maintenance crews and the public. All street parking exceptions are suspended during major winter storms.

### **Residental Roads:**

These roads are plowed after the priority areas have been cleared and once 10 cm of snow has accumulated. The plowing starts as soon as the storm has ended.

Residential roads are plowed to a "snow packed" standard and not "bare pavement" as these roads are a different classification than priority roads.

### Be a good neighbour:

While Milton works around the clock to clear the roads and keep everyone moving, residents can also help keep their streets and paths clear during winter weather. Please be a good neighbour by clearing your sidewalks of snow/ ice and helping others on your street who need assistance.
